Never a dull moment onboard MV Iris Harmony.



MV Iris Harmony loaded alumina in Sao Luis in Brazil and departed on the 4th of October for discharge in Iceland. Arrival was on 18th of October. Last Tuesday, 20th, a swarm of earthquakes started in the peninsula close to the capital with a strength of 5.6 on Richter scale. The discharge port is only around 30 km from the source and this was clearly felt onshore in the south-western part. We were curious to understand whether this was felt onboard.

The following description was received from Captain Renelo: "When the earthquake happened, we are doing excercises with our Fast Rescue Boat. While lowering we notice a sudden jerk on the quay side, mooring lines suddenly tightened due to vessel's moving against the fender. Small waves was recognizable coming inside the port entrance. Other crew was on the bridge wing taking pictures they observed also with a sudden jerk from the side of the ship. They thought that the rescue boat fell down to the water from hook. However everyone of us did not mind at all and were not aware it was an earthquake untill such we read in the local news. But beforehand I received an notice from our safety department that there will be a tsunami in Alaska.".

Another incident which proves that life at sea is full of challenges and our brave seafarers are facing all challenges head on! Good work by the Safety and Quality department to monitor all such movements and keep our vessels updated. "Together we sail..."
